

Possible activities to complete at home

To continue with learning at home, please try some of the following activities:

Reading	Spend time reading your reading book and recording this in your school planner. Remember that reading is an excellent way to develop your vocabulary and is great for mindfulness. Year 7 could also try and create that winning shot to enter the 'Read Anywhere' competition (photos@callertonacademy.org.uk)
Homework	Use the time to work on your homework project

Activity 1	Watch an episode of Planet Earth on BBC iPlayer and write down all the animals you learn about and ten facts about these animals, their habitats and the natural world.
Activity 2	Write a short story using one of these titles as inspiration: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Gift • A New Adventure • Alien Attack • Truth
Activity 3	Design a theme park. This could include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A map of the site • A description of the rides, amusements and activities (Try and be descriptive and creative with your language) • A poster advertising the theme park.
Activity 4	Read and watch the news on the BBC Newsround website. You may wish to make a note of what you watch/read so that you can share it with your peers.
Activity 5	Students in both year groups have the option to complete lessons, online homework or worksheets on My Maths which they have used regularly in school. Year 7 students can revise the topics studied in the autumn term by watching videos available on this link: https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning?year=year-7 Following the recent assessment students reviewed their answers and selected areas for improvement. Activity 6	Draw a self-portrait using the different skills and shading you have had in your Art lessons.
Activity 7	Research a topic you've been studying in one of your lessons and create a one sided fact sheet about it. You may choose to research electromagnetism, glaciation, a career you're interested in, a significant historical event, a genre of music, rules of a sport, or an event from Chinese history to name but a few.
